Temporary Agreement
Towns of Jonesboro & Roque Bluffs
Shellfish Line
2026

The temporary agreement particularly references establishing a line dividing on flats for the purposes of harvesting; enforcement; and conservation measures for the town's shellfish programs of Jonesboro and Roque Bluffs. This temporary agreement is as stated, a temporary agreement between the Town of Jonesboro and the Town of Roque Bluffs and will be enforced by the wardens of said towns or other parties deemed.

The portion of the line is not, and evidently never has been, marked by artificial monuments, therefore, this temporary agreement between the Town of Jonesboro and the Town of Roque Bluffs have agreed to use the thread of the Sheep Creek and Tide Mill creek as natural monuments. The said towns have agreed the temporary line will start at the sheep creek near Lot 7 coming into Tide Mill creek. Following the Tide Mill Creek around the old Tide Mill dam and flowing down past Poverty Island (other named is Rotoroa Island, Lot 7) within Tide Mill Cove, keeping to the South-Eastern creek closest to Poverty Island, following west through the "old mussel bed" feeding outwards into Chandler River. The Tide Mill flats west of the Tide Mill Creek's thread are the Town of Jonesboro's for purposes of harvesting; enforcement; and conservation measures. The flats between the Tide Mill creek and Poverty Island on the east of the said creek and to the east are the Town of Roque Bluffs' for the purpose of harvesting; enforcement; and conservation measures. To add more clarity of the temporary agreement in this area, GPS coordinates will be added on an additional map. We, the towns, are in understanding that the creeks may shift and accept the possibility of this instance being admitted. But since the subject creek's thread under frequent observation over the considerable period of years has not changed. Said creeks are fit for a monument for the temporary agreement.
